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Hello! This time I'm going to tell you about levels of English from my point of view. And I hope, it'll be useful for you!

So, in my opinion, there are 7 levels of English:

- 1) Beginner.
- 2) Elementary.
- 3) Intermediate.
- 4) Upper Intermediate.
- 5) General Advanced.
- 6) Advanced.
- 7) Native speaker.

1. Beginner.

You don't know anything about English. You've never learnt it before.

2. Elementary.

You might have learnt English a while at school or somewhere else. Your vocabulary is poor. You know words like: a cat, a dog, a pen etc. You know how to say: «Hi! My name is ... How are you?» You know some moments of grammar. You can't speak and you don't understand the English speech.

3. Intermediate.

So, your vocabulary is still poor. Your pronunciation is normal. You can say some simple phrases. You can understand the very clear speech. You can write and read. You know the basics of grammar pretty good. This is a medium level of English. Exactly this level is often required by employers (not foreign of course).

4. Upper Intermediate.

Your pronunciation is good. Your vocabulary is good. You understand people discussing familiar for you subjects. You can speak pretty fluently. You know all the necessary rules of grammar. This is a conversational level of English. This is a good level.

5. General Advanced.

This is a serious level of English. You speak quickly. Your vocabulary is broad. You can understand and discuss not only common topics, but more difficult ones (f.e. technical or business fields).

6. Advanced.

Excellent level. You speak English practically like a native speaker. Your daily English is perfect. You know grammar very well. You can talk about sciences, medicine, technologies, busyness.

And I think that people can have such a level only in a case, if they've lived in English speaking country for about one year or more.

7. Native speaker.

So, It's clear for you I guess.

In addition I'd like to say, that we can't learn a new language in full. We can be very good only in the fields we really need. And when you hear from people such a phrase: «I'm free in English» This mainly means they're absolutely free in conversational English, they know grammar (some people may be teachers). They can discuss the most part of subjects (BUT NOT ANY ONE!!!). This is my opinion, but I can even prove it. Look at your native language, for example Russian. Tell me, could you talk to me, for example, about this subject - "параллелизм функционирования разделенных подсистем сложной системы при E-сетевом моделировании". I bet you couldn't. Why? Because you know nothing about it, you have no vocabulary for it. And if you can't talk about it in your mother language, how are you going to discuss this, for example, in English?

So, I think that people can learn English for all their life. Any language, I'm not saying only about English.

It was my thoughts about levels of English, guys. Hope, it helped you to define yours.
